- Slow Down. In normal conditions, you should maintain a following distance of three seconds between you and another car. On winter roads, increase that to a full 8 to 10 seconds. Yes, that may mean slow going, but a little patience will keep you a lot safer on the road.
- Get Unstuck the Right Way. Avoid the temptation to spin your wheels. You'll just dig yourself into a deeper hole. Instead, determine the path of least resistance between your car and solid ground. Then, clear the snow behind and in front of all four tires and liberally spread sand or kitty litter in front of and behind the drive wheels. Keep in mind that the sharper your front wheels are turned, the more resistance to movement in either direction you create. Consequently, try to keep the front tires as straight as possible.
- Tackle a Skid the Smart Way. If your car skids, keep a cool head, and follow these steps:
 - O Don't panic.
 - O Don't slam on the brakes.
 - Take your foot off the gas.
 - Steer your car in the direction you want to go.
 - Wait for the car to slow down so you can regain control.

Road Ditches

With the winter precipitation and impending spring rains, please remember to keep the road ditches free of debris such as tall grass, leaves, branches and bagged lawn clippings. During rain events, any items in the road ditches could be transported by the water collecting in the road ditch. The debris could then become lodged around or in the culverts downstream creating blockages and hampering the effectiveness of the drainage system.



Contractor's Licenses

For any of your upcoming projects please remember the city requires all contractors, conducting business in the city limits, to obtain a contractor's license. The requirements for obtaining a contractor's license are minimal; proof of liability insurance and a \$25 processing fee are all that is required. These requirements insure your work is being completed by a contractor who is interested in protecting your property. Talk to your contractor and inquire if they have a license prior to starting the project. Licenses are available at City Hall.

Pet Licenses

All dogs and cats who reside within the city limits of the City of Auxvasse are required to have a pet license. The licenses are renewed yearly at the same time as the pet's rabies vaccination. The fee for the license is \$5.00 per year. The license will aid the city in contacting the owner of the pet in the event they are loose and making sure the pet is returned as quickly as possible. Please keep your pets on a leash if outside of your house unless they are in a fenced in yard.

House Numbers

Please remember each house or building within the City Limits is required to display their House Number. The House Numbers are there to aid emergency services, fire, health, and police, in locating individual locations in time of need. The House Number should be located within 5 feet of the front door of the building and should be no less than 3 inches in height with the lines of the numbers no less than ½" in width. These numbers should be plainly readable from the street. If the building is set back from the street far enough that it is not feasible to display a readable number on the building, it is permitted to display the number on a sign. The sign shall posted a height not less than 24 inches from the ground and not in excess of 72 inches from the ground and no more than 15 feet from the street edge.




